CALL TO ORDER

Pursuant to public notice, the meeting of Renaissance Charter Schools Inc. commenced at 2:03 pm with a Call to Order by Chairman Ken Haiko. Roll call was taken and quorum established.

I. ADMINISTRATIVE

Approval of Renaissance Charter Schools, Inc. Minutes from February 10, 2016

• Chairman Haiko asked the Board to review the minutes from February 10, 2016 and to note any changes.

MOTION: Motion was made by Dennis Clark and seconded by Tom Wheeler to approve the minutes of the February 10, 2016 Renaissance Charter Schools, Inc. board meeting. Motion was approved (4-0)(3 absent).

II. SCHOOL REPORTS

School Reports

Governors Charter Academy

- Principal Dr. Adriane Peters presented the school report to the board to include enrollment at 684 students with a budgeted amount of 808.
- Principal Peters reported on some of the PTC events including a "Bring Your Parents to School Day" that was very successful and had significant parental participation in the upper grades.

Renaissance Charter School at Central Palm

- Principal Jackson Self presented the school report to the board to include enrollment at 764 with a budgeted amount of 753 students. Recommitments are high at 97%.
- Principal Self reported on other school activities, highlights include: a successful and fun family night at the local Barnes & Noble book store.

Renaissance Charter School at Cypress

 Principal Rachel Mellion Enrollment reported at 568 students with a budgeted amount of 638 students. Recommits are at 548 and they have had 190 new applications. PTC events and highlights include: a Spring Fundraiser and a Family Learning Fair that focused on cultural awareness.

Renaissance Charter School at Palms West

- Assistant Principal Gabriella Gonda presented the school report to the board to include enrollment currently at 761 for budget 995.
- PTC events and provided highlights to include: ongoing FSA prep and a Family Fun night at a local Tijuana Flats. The Spring Dance also took place in March and was very successful.

Renaissance Charter School at St. Lucie

- Assistant Principal Christiana Coburn present the school report to the board to include enrollment reported at 1270 students with a budgeted amount of 1290 students. Recommits is currently at 95%.
- PTC events and highlights include: Ongoing professional development with the teacher, FSA Prep Night, Family Fun Night, and a dance at the school.

Renaissance Charter School at Summit

- Principal Heather Czeskleba presented the school report to the board to include enrollment reported at 955 students with a budgeted amount of 1047 students. There is 257 new applications. Cambridge will be added to the 6-8 grades.
- PTC activities and school highlights to include: Math Night and a Scholastic book fair held at the school.

Renaissance Charter School at Tradition

- Assistant Principal Alison Simpson presented the school report to the board to include enrollment reported at 1054 students with a budgeted amount of 1070 students.
- PTC activities and school highlights to include: A spring dance for 3rd-5th grade, Saturday tutoring, 8th grade field trip to Washington DC, and an FSA Informational Parent night.

Renaissance Charter School at Wellington

- Principal Andrea Reilly presented the school report to the board to include enrollment reported at 522 students with a budgeted amount 638 students. Recommits are at 97%.
- PTC activities and school highlights to include: Science Saturday and Dr. Seuss Week where the school celebrated literacy and the students dressed as their favorite Dr. Seuss characters.

Renaissance Charter School at West Palm Beach

- Principal Michael Lupton presented the school report to the board to include enrollment reported at 935 students with a budgeted amount 972 students. They have 437 new applicants.
- PTC activities and school highlights to include: Jump Rope for the Heart fundraiser where they
 raised \$4000 for that charity, FSA writing testing, and Saturday University for the next two
 weeks.

III. NEW BUSINESS

NWEA Fall Reporting:

- The Regional Education Directors presented the board with the NWEA Fall Benchmark results for the targeted and new schools for the Renaissance Charter School, Inc. portfolio of schools.
- The board discussed these results and any questions were answered by the Principals and the Regional Directors.

ESOL/Out of Field Waivers

The board reviewed and discussed Out of Field Waivers for schools that were presented.

MOTION: Motion was made by Thomas Wheeler and seconded by Shane Strum to approve the ESOL/Out of Field Waivers as presented (see attached). Motion was approved unanimously.

Approval of Parent/Student Handbooks

- The board was presented with the 2015-16 Parent/Student Handbooks for all schools governed by Renaissance Charter Schools, Inc.
- The board reviewed and discussed the 2015-16 Parent/Student Handbooks and all requests for clarity were answered by the Principals and/or Regional Director.

MOTION: Motion was made by Thomas Wheeler and seconded by Dennis Clark to approve the 2015-16 Parent/Student Handbooks, as presented. Motion was approved unanimously.

Renaissance Charter School at Summit Staff Recognition Funds

• Principal Heather Czeskleba provided an overview of the SAC meeting convened at the school and decisions reached by SAC committee regarding school recognition funds.

MOTION: Motion was made by Thomas Wheeler and seconded by Shane Strum to approve the Recognition Funds option selected by Renaissance Charter School at Summit. Motion was approved unanimously.

Duval Charter School at Arlington (Scholars Academy) Staff Recognition Funds

Principal Michelle Thompson provided an overview of the SAC meeting convened at the school and decisions reached by SAC committee regarding school recognition funds.

MOTION: Motion was made by Thomas Wheeler and seconded by Dennis Clark to approve the Recognition Funds option by Duval Charter School at Arlington (Scholars Academy). Motion was approved unanimously.

IV. OLD BUSINESS

• Derek Kelmanson, CSUSA, provided an update of the potential new schools in the Orlando Metro area.

 Chairman Haiko shared with the board that the Appellate Court in Tallahassee overturned the Palm Beach County District's decision to deny the new high school application. The next step is to go before the State Board of Education for approval.
